

Paul Lammermeier Memorial Cup

a new tradition, sharing Paul's legacy

Last summer, a group of Paul's former students and colleagues formed the **Paul Lammermeier Memorial Committee** to devise ways to share Paul's legacy. They established three goals for their collaborative work:

Goal #1: Preserving Paul's Legacy

Goal #2: Transforming Lives Through Acts of Service Goal #3: A Collaborative Endeavor for a Common

Good

The primary focus this fall was the proposal of the Paul Lammermeier Memorial Cup: a yearly recognition of the winner of the annual regular-season football game between Saint Xavier and Saint Ignatius high schools. The football teams have been playing an annual game for 30 years and have met in the State of Ohio championship game three times. The Committee worked with both schools to agree to name this annual match the Paul Lammermeier Memorial Cup, created a trophy that the winning school will display for the year, encourages the teams to do acts of community service around the annual game, and shares Paul's story with the team and spectators.

The inaugural Paul Lammermeier Memorial game was held in Cleveland on a rainy mid-October day. It was a tough game, with St. Xavier pulling out a victory in overtime.

Congratulations to the Paul Lammermeier Memorial Committee for this effort. We are honored to support your efforts to preserve Paul's legacy.
