Fr. Kevin Flaherty, SJ once again traveled from Peru to join us for the evening and share first-hand about the dedication of the ACJ team and the successes of the children and youth in Lima. His stories left us excited and hopeful. PLF also introduced and publicly launched our Carrying on the Legacy| Building Bright Futures Campaign, and guests heard from several supporters who have generously invested in the campaign thus far.

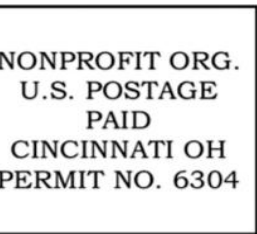

a three-year strategic plan to carry on Paul Lammermeier's legacy

Our past shapes our future, and those of us at PLF and ACJ (our partner organization in Lima) are honored to carry on Paul's mission and legacy. Through his selfless example, Paul provided us the "why" for this mission, and together, we've been able to help more than 75 young people to date. Now, we're embracing the hard work of the long term "how." To sustain and carry forth Paul's mission and legacy, PLF has embarked on a three-year, dual focused campaign.

Equal Opportunities for Bright Futures

Since the opening of Casa Teresa over 10 year ago, the three oldest residents have turned 18 and have begun their university studies – an amazing accomplishment for these young women! Over the next two years, four more Casa Teresa residents will turn 18 and begin their next phases. Peruvian law states that youth 18 and older may not live in the same residence as minors when living in a foster care-type environment. To provide the same opportunity for the young women of ACJ that we do for the young men – pursuing university studies, supported in a loving, family environment until they can step out and succeed on their own – ACJ and PLF must establish a new residence. A fourth home, christened Casa Edith by Paul before his passing, has been identified, and a purchase agreement is in place. The house is located next to Casa Javier, and the purchase and renovation costs combined for the new home are estimated to be \$500,000. We are committed to providing this opportunity and security to our young women residents.

Carrying on the Legacy

Up until his passing in August 2022, Paul shared his hope and desire that the program in Lima continue. The Boards and staff of PLF and ACJ are committed to continuing the work that Paul started well into the future. What began over 25 years ago has developed into a well-rounded program, with boys and girls being cared for and supported in a loving, family-style environment and provided with quality education through university studies. A team of professional, capable, committed staff is in place in Lima, supported by an active local board. In collaboration with the PLF board, plans have been put into place to ensure the long-term success of the program. Including their college studies, residents sometimes participate in the program for over ten years. We wish to fulfill our commitment until our residents can live on their own. We wish to continue welcoming new youth into the program as older residents graduate and start lives on their own. To do this, PLF seeks to build a legacy fund to ensure a stable funding source well into the future.

We are halfway to our goal of \$2.25 million. Will you join us?

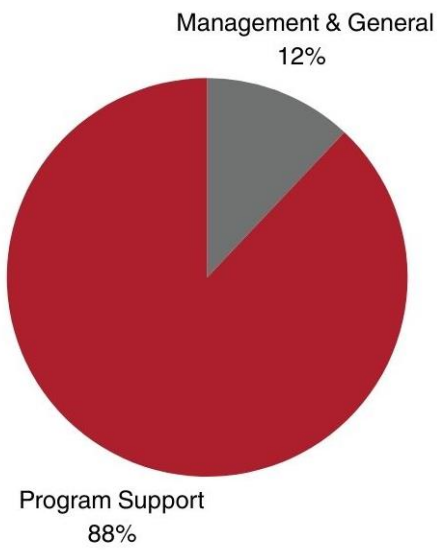

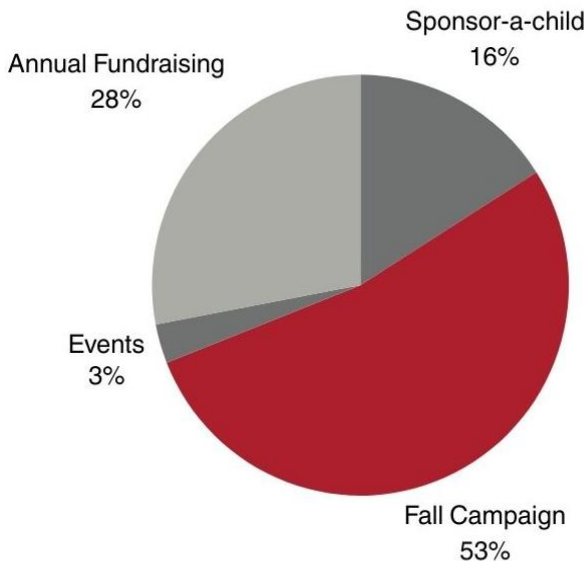
